



21. PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADES 7 -9

(1) Learners in Grades 7-9 will be promoted from grade to grade if they have offered nine (9) subjects listed in paragraph 19(1) to (8) and have complied with the promotion requirements in eight (8) of the subjects as contemplated in subparagraphs (a) to (e), provided the School-Based Assessment component of the ninth subject has been completed.



GEC Roll Out

- (a) Adequate Achievement (Level 4) in one language at Home Language level as contemplated in paragraph 19(1);
- (b) Moderate Achievement (Level 3) in the second required official language at First Additional Language level as contemplated in paragraph 19(1);
- (c) Moderate Achievement (Level 3) in Mathematics as contemplated in paragraph 19(2);
- (d) Moderate Achievement (Level 3) in any three (3) of the other required subjects as contemplated in *paragraphs* 19(3), 19(4), 19(5), 19(6), 19(7) and 19(8); [or] and
- (e) Subject to subparagraph (f), at least an Elementary Achievement (Level 2) in any two (2) of the other required subjects as contemplated in paragraphs 19(3), 19(4), 19(5), 19(6), 19(7) and 19(8).
- (f) Immigrant learners may be exempted from achieving one official language as contemplated in paragraph 4(1)(c)(ii), provided they obtain at least an Elementary Achievement (Level 2) in all three (3) the remaining subjects contemplated in subparagraph (e).

Mark Adjustment and Condonation





Mark Adjustment and Condonation

Mark adjustment and condonation dispensation will be as follows:

- (a) Mark adjustments are applicable only to learners in Grades 4–9.
- (b) A mark adjustment of a maximum of 5% is allowed in a maximum of three subjects offered by the learner. This implies that a learner can be awarded a mark of between 1% and 5% of the mark attained by the learner, if this will give the learner an achieved status.
- (C) Thereafter, the condonation in Mathematics must be applied. Where a learner has met all the requirements in respect of promotion from one grade to the next grade, except has not attained a level 3 or higher (40% and higher) in Mathematics and therefore has to be retained, such a learner must be condoned in Mathematics. This implies that the Mathematics mark is condoned and the learner must be promoted to the next grade, if all other pass requirements are met.
- (d) The condonation in Mathematics is also applicable only to learners in Grades 4 to 9.





Application of Mark Adjustment and Condonation

• 3b. A mark adjustment of a maximum of 5% is allowed in a maximum of three subjects offered by the learner, if this will give the learner an achieved status

Scenario 1
