Summary 21st-century leaders and learners

Being 21st-Century leaders, collaborative problem solving

The purpose of the World Cafe is to provide a framework for you to collaboratively problem-solve real-world authentic problems that relate to the integrated projects. The purpose of this exercise is to give you the opportunity to explore they key issues around the integrated projects while exercising your ability to practice and grow your 21st-Century Skills.





The process of a World Café

- Establish Table Host: One person volunteers to be the host for Round
 1.
- **2. Round 1 Discussion**: Discuss the first question. Host records key points.
- **3. Table Shuffle:** Except for the host, everyone switches tables.
- **4. Round 2 Begins:** Round 1 host recaps key points. A new host is selected.
- **5. Round 2 Discussion**: Discuss the second question. New host records key points.
- 6. Table Shuffle & Repeat: Repeat steps 3-5 for Round 3.

World Café Round 1

- 1. Elect your table host
- 2. Discuss question How can we help teachers to work together during the integrated project? The success of the integrated project depends on teachers working together. How can we support them to start this teamwork, so the project goes well?
- 3. Host makes notes







World Café Round 2

- **1.** Host from round 1 remains, everyone else changes tables.
- 2. Recap the discussions from the previous rounds



- **3.** Elect a new table host
- 4. Discuss question: How can we best use the time available in our current schedule for the integrated projects? The success of integrated projects requires effective time management. Teachers may need to adjust their existing schedules to accommodate activities like public presentations and longer classes for research (consecutive periods in e.g., math, science and tech), gaming, experimentation, and building. Do you have any suggestions on how you as educational leaders could assist teachers in managing time during these projects?
- 5. Host makes notes





World Café Round 3

- **1.** Host from round 2 remains, everyone else changes tables.
- 2. Recap the discussions from the previous rounds
- 3. Elect a new table host
- 4. Discuss What solutions or options can we think of where schools might not have the 'traditional resources' for a project e.g. the snap kit for technology?
- 5. Host makes notes
